Wilfred E. Smith, former jitney bus inspector, and now dispatcher for the interurban lines, was awakened by a peculiar noise on his front porch, and saw a huge cat crouched for a spring. He reached for his 30-30 Winchester and fired, killing the animal instantly. Smith's home is at the head of Laurel Canyon. He says the animal he shot is one of the largest wild cats ever killed near this city. He found on examining his rabbit hutches that every rabbit had been killed, that a number of chickens had been mutilated, and his dog frightened away.
